


# Geography

Year 7 took part in the Antarctica flag competition. Here are some of the winning entries.















The Saracens High School overall winner was Ginni from 7Rimla her flag is now on its way to Antarctica!

### Science

In Science, Year 7 and 8 have been learning about matter and organisms, which includes separating mixtures, particle model, elements, periodic table, breathing, digestion, movement & cells.

In Year 9, the Combined Science groups have been studying cell structure, microscopy, transport & cell division, and have just completed their first chemistry unit on atomic structure. They have also completed their required practicals on microscopy, osmosis and chromatography.

The Single Science group have also completed some physics content on energy.

In Year 10, the combined science groups have completed work on communicable and non-communicable diseases, and preventing and treating disease. The Single Science class have also completed additional chemistry and physics content, including chemical calculations and titrations, and electricity.


Since moving to the new building, we have been able to improve the practical science opportunities available to students.











#### **Diabetes Awareness**





At the end of November, to mark 100 years since the discovery of insulin, Bradley (9 Wilberforce) planned and delivered a presentation on diabetes awareness to all students and staff. The Loom presentation outlined details regarding diabetes, signs and treatment, but also included things not to say to a diabetic and ruled out some myths that people believe are true. Thanks to the kind generosity of students, staff and families, nearly £100 has been raised for Diabetes UK, on the page created by Bradley. ### Blindfold football

Pupils at Saracens High School had the opportunity at lunch time to play blind football in small teams. The ball with the bell inside guided the players towards the goal. "At first I thought it will be strange, and by the end of the game I realised how hard it was for the people to play. You have to listen a lot more and pay attention to everyone and every sound you hear" said Caitlin in Year 9 Alphonsi. "This experience made us think a lot about what we take for granted. I did not realise how hard it is not to be able to do simple things like walking and touching things".



### Jodie Ounsley - "My deafness is a super power "

On Wednesday 15 December 2021, rugby player, Jodie Ounsley, attended a Question & Answer session. Pupils were able to ask her questions on how she managed to overcome physical barriers in her life.

Jodie, who is profoundly deaf, continues to break down barriers within women's sport both on and off the pitch. Being only 20-years old, Jodie has built a reputation as one of rugby's most exciting new

stars. "When I was 14-months old, my Mum and Dad were encouraged to get me fitted with a cochlear implant. I only had one fitted because at the time, it wasn't common to have two. Nowadays though, it's a lot more common for children to be fitted with two. I prefer one so I can play rugby" said Jodie. Her presentation inspired a lot of the pupils and reiterated the message that with hard work and discipline, all is possible.

# Food preparation and nutrition

All years made a great start in our second brand new food room! We have gas and electric cookers installed to encourage pupils to be confident in using both types.

Year 7 have learned basic knife skills and cooking skills, making dishes such as banana flapjacks, apple crumble, Macaroni cheese, savoury scones and decorated biscuits.



Year 8 have learned how to make pastry and bread dishes, such as pasties, apple pies and pizza. They have also made sweet and savoury muffins and pasta bake.



Year 9 have started their GCSE course and are learning about nutrition and food safety as well as improving their practical skills. Dishes they have made so far include chicken stir fry, vegan Bolognese, Macaroni cheese with leeks, pavlova and Victoria sandwich cake.



Year 10 have been perfecting their cooking skills and practicing their presentation skills. They have made dishes using short crust, sweet and rough puff pastry this term, as well as high skilled dairy dishes such as Panna Cotta (pictured) and Eclairs.

They have also had the opportunity to cook with and sample fresh mussels, kindly provided by the Fish Heroes, schools programme.
