### A message from the Principal

Due to the pandemic, for much of this year 'we have been the school we needed to be' and not the school we wanted to be. In the last few weeks we have started to be the school we want to be more and more. This started after the Easter break when we began to run extra-curricular activities again. We assessed pupils' academic progress and could see the progress that they had made, which I am pleased to say is back to being in line with our expectations. We are particularly pleased to have received very positive feedback from the external English assessments, which enabled us to compare our Year 7 pupils' progress with thousands of other children across the country. At the beginning of the year the children were on average a long way behind the national average, but they have closed the gap dramatically, especially boys, so well done to the pupils and their English teachers.

We returned to our Futures Programme earlier in the year over Zoom, and it was wonderful to host 30 speakers in school, who told the pupils all about their chosen professions and inspired them to learn more about jobs in those fields.

We also returned to developing character education, which has been evident with so many pupils ticking off activities towards their Edge qualifications. Despite the disruption to the year we have presented a staggering 170 Edge certificates, including 57 Graduate awards, which for those Year 9s is their third qualification in Character Education. They must now wait until Year 12 before they can begin the 'Masters' qualification.

Finally, this past week has seen the return to our Making Memories activities. Trips to the RAF museum, the beach, playing crazy golf, going bowling, or ice skating, and watching Chickenshed or listening to a visiting author have created many, many special memories.

We know that academic progress is important, but it will be memories created from these activities that our children will tell their grandchildren

about in fifty years time, and I am very proud of the staff for their passion and commitment in organising such engaging and memorable events.

At the end of the year we often say goodbye to staff who are moving on. This year we are bidding farewell to Mrs Smith, who is moving across the country with her young family. Mrs Smith joined us in 2018 and has done a wonderful job of building an excellent Maths team and she will be missed. We are also saying goodbye to a number of our wonderful non-teaching staff. Mr Sudell, our School Counsellor, is going to start a PhD to enable him to become a Child Psychotherapist within the NHS; Miss Atkinson is leaving us to move back north and to train to be a Maths teacher; Mr Neto is going to train to be a Business Studies teacher; Miss Lingham is also moving away to further her rugby career; Miss Morrissey is also returning to the north of England where she will train to be a Science teacher; and Miss Shapiro is moving away to train to become an Educational Psychologist. We are grateful for their contribution to the school and wish them all the best for their future careers.

Internally, we have some staff changing jobs as Ms Ege becomes a Cover Supervisor; Miss Copeland becomes a Learning Mentor-Pastoral Support; Miss Boxall will be a Geography teacher; and Mr Rudd is taking on more History teaching next year. We also have lots of new teachers joining us, and I will share more information about them in the Parent Bulletin in the first week of September.

Please make sure that you read the letter about Covid testing over the holiday and the start of term dates, which have changed for Year 9 and 10 pupils because of the imposed testing that we need to carry out for Year 7 pupils.

I hope you have a wonderful and safe summer break.

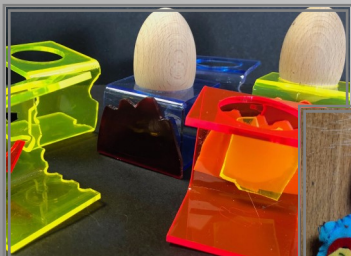

## The Edge

At Saracens High School we realise the importance of learning. However, we are also very aware that it is important that pupils develop their Character too. The Edge awards require them to complete activities in five 'character' attributes: Leadership, Organisation, Resilience, Initiative and Communication (LORIC).

The Edge Apprentice Award should be completed across Year 7 and 8. This involved completing 10 activities all aimed at developing and demonstrating LORIC characteristics.

We have seen fantastic activities completed such as Gabriel's superb presentation on the dangers of drugs in 7 Johnson or the litter picking sessions that all Year 7 houses engaged in throughout the Summer Term.

In total 42 pupils in Year 7 completed the Apprentice Award and will receive a certificate and a badge as recognition of their achievements!

The rest of the year group will continue working to achieve the award next year.

97 pupils in Year 8 have also completed the Apprentice Award. 13 pupils even managed to complete the Pioneer Award, an award for those with the desire to further demonstrate that they have The Edge! There have been assemblies and presentations throughout the year where pupils were able to demonstrate their LORIC skills in front of an audience of their peers and teachers.

## **Science**

I was very happy and excited to start as Subject Lead for Science in June, and would like to thank all of the staff and pupils for making me feel so welcome and supported. I look forward to making contact with families in the near future.

All year groups have completed their end of year exams, with some outstanding results achieved, which shows how hard the pupils have worked at school and at home.

Year 7 and 8 had 1 paper each, combined science in Year 9 had a Biology and Chemistry paper, with the separate science class sitting 3 papers, 1 each for Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

Year 7 have been doing chemistry, specifically learning about acids and bases and the differences between them. During this they have carried out some practical work, including investigating different indicators, such as universal indicator, litmus paper and red cabbage indicator, seeing how they interact and change with different solutions. They have also seen how different metals react with acids and how to name salts.

Year 8 have been studying force fields and electromagnets, learning about static electricity, current, voltage, resistance and electromagnets, including practical work on resistance in a wire.

In combined science, Year 9 have been doing their first physics topic, looking at energy and learning some of the equations that they will need to use in their GCSE exams. They have learned about different energy stores and transfers and how to calculate kinetic energy, gravitational potential energy and efficiency. In separate science in Year 9, they have been studying chemical changes in chemistry and forces in physics.

## **Times Table Rockstars (Year 7)**

When pupils join Saracens High School our aim to motivate them to achieve their potential both personally and academically. In Maths we aim to consolidate learning from Key Stage 2 and use this learning as a spring board for developing conceptual understanding in the key areas of Maths.

Times tables form a fundamental part of the Maths journey at secondary school underpinning the connections between numbers. For this reason in Year 7 every pupil is given the challenge of 'graduating from Times Table Rockstars'.

In order to do this pupils must complete the home learning set each week and progress through the levels of the online platform. To graduate, pupils must achieve level 420. This demonstrates they have a firm grasp of the times tables up to 12 x 12 and the associated division facts.

This year we have seen a phenomenal number of pupils graduating from TTRS. As it stands we have 64 pupils who have graduated from TTRS this year.

Special mention to 7 Johnson who have over half of their learning group graduating this year! Special mention also to Elsa in 7 Wilberforce who has the fastest speed, answering a question every 0.56 seconds!

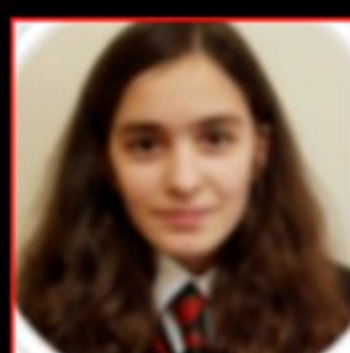

Through videos, pictures and artefacts from the time, Hephzibah painted a vivid picture of the immense difficulties that her mother faced, including her time in Bergen-Belsen concentration camp. It was a remarkable tale of three generations and how twists of fate played an integral role in Zahava's survival. Year 8 were privileged to listen to such a personal account of Holocaust survival and were able to make links to her story during their History lessons, which focused on Holocaust remembrance, this term.
