

Before and After School

- A free breakfast club runs from 7.45 each morning serving a selection of cereals, bagels and fruit
- After-school clubs are free and begin at 3.30pm (3.00pm on a Friday)
- Clubs are run by teachers, support staff and external groups like the Saracens Sports Foundation
- We also have a wide selection of lunchtime clubs
- Details of clubs are shared at the start of each term
- We expect everyone to take part in at least one club per week the more the better!



Learning Groups

- Each learning group has 15 pupils and one Learning Coach
- Learning groups meet twice a day before lessons and after lessons
- You will get to know your Learning Coach well. They are the person to speak to if you have questions or concerns
- 'Family Read' happens during morning Learning Group. Your Learning Coach will read to you simply for the enjoyment of reading. Over your 5 years at Saracens High School you will read approximately 15 books this way.
- In afternoon Learning Group there is time to work in silence, making a start on homework or preparing for assessments
- One morning a week you will go to an assembly


Family Lunch




Arbor

- Our Head Chef is a professional chef, working with Chefs In Schools
- We enjoy meals that are healthy, freshly prepared, full of flavour and filling







- The food is halal
- Pupils are not allowed to bring packed lunches
- Lunch time is split into 25 minutes for eating and 25 minutes for playing
- Payment for lunches is via Arbor and must be paid in advance. If you get free school meals, your account will be credited with the correct amount each day. If you don't get free school meals, a parent/carer will need to top up your account online, and the amount will be taken from your account if you are in school. If you are absent, your parent/carer does not pay.
- There is a free breakfast from 7.45 each day. You do not need to sign up, just turn up on days you'd like to
- Fruit is provided at after school clubs but you are also allowed to bring in fruit or vegetables for a breaktime snack

Home Learning





- Just one hour of home learning a day during term time will give you the equivalent of an additional year's worth of lessons
- Home learning is set on Satchel One
- You are also expected to read at home
- Satchel One and Arbor are two apps that you and your parents/carers should download. We use these daily to communicate with pupils and their families
- Satchel One is for homework; Arbor is the primary way the school communicates with your family via texts and emails. It is also where your family can track your attendance and rewards.



Houses

- You will remain in the same house throughout your time at Saracens High School
- You will find out which house you will be in during your first assembly our tie presentation assembly. Parents/carers are invited to attend
- Ties have a different colour stripe to show which house pupils are in
- Over the year the houses compete to win the house points competitions.
- Points are awarded for effort, behaviour, contributions, living our values, etc.


Lost Property




- Please label all of your uniform and other items

Equipment



Attendance and Punctuality



- There is a direct link between pupils who attend most often and their exam results
- We are strict about attendance and punctuality and reward excellent attendance
- Your target should be 100% attendance
- No pupil should have attendance below 97% unless there is an ongoing medical issue
- If a pupil were to miss three days each half-term from Year 7 to Year 11 they would miss half a year of school!
- If you feel a little unwell please be resilient and still come in. If you feel worse dyring the day you may need to go home.
- If you have had sickness or diarrhea you need to stay off school for 48 hours. You need to call the school office for every day that your child is off sick.
- If you arrive late (after 8.20), you will need to sign in at reception.
- If you have to leave school early for any reason, you will need to ask permission from your Learning Coach at least one day before. A letter or email must be sent to the school office with a copy of the appointment card or confirmation email from the hospital/doctor/ dentist/orthodontist.


Medical Issues



- If you need to have medicine in school, your parent/carer must contact the school to find out how they need it sent in and they will also need to sign a document
- The school must look after medicine to store it properly and keep it safe
- The only medicine you can keep on you is an inhaler and you must ensure this is kept in your blazer and taken to your PE lessons. The school will keep a spare inhaler.
- If you need an Epi-Pen at school we will need to have documentation completed
- Please ensure that the school has up to date information on any medical conditions that you have



Rewards and Behaviour - (

Respectful



Our rewards systems focuses on the pupils who are:

- READY to learn
- RESPECTFUL of themselves, those around them, and the environment
- and behave SAFELY

We love to give rewards and if you meet our high standards in lessons and other areas of school life you will be rewarded.

We will recognise:

- Living our values
- Commendable effort
- Contribution to the school and our community
- General good behaviour
- High quality class or home learning
- Politeness and good manners
- Progress (academic)

Rewards include:



- House points
- Praise notes and phone calls home
- Hot Chocolate with the Principal
- End of year awards at our formal Celebration of Achievement evening each July

When you have a great day and get lots of rewards, someone at home may receive an email via Arbor before you get home!

If pupils are not ready, respectful or safe the following steps will be followed:




- Step 1: The pupil will be reminded of the school's expectations
- Step 2: If the negative behaviour continues they will be given a negative entry on Arbor and will need some time out from the lesson. Depending on the response, they may be given a chance to go back into the class to make amends.
- Step 3: If our expectations are still not met the pupil will be exited from the lesson and an email will be sent home, followed by a phonecall from the teacher. They will need to complete the work that they missed after school that day in an after-school Reparation Meeting. They will also need to complete a form that asks them to think about their behaviour that caused the problem and its consequences. They will need to plan what they would do differently in a similar situation. We do not have detentions that 'punish' negative behaviour. We learn about what went wrong and what to do differently if we are in that situation again. Families will be notified that their child has an after-school Reparation Meeting by text, email, or phone call.



Presentation

It is important that you take great pride in your classwork and home learning. Below is an example of the standard we expect.



Anti-Bullying



- Bullying is the deliberate harming, threatening or frightening of someone. It does not need to be physical, it can also be emotional (upsetting someone), or social (ignoring or shutting someone out). Name calling, mocking and teasing are bullying, even when it is called 'banter'. Use of the internet, social media or mobile technology to bully or intimidate students or other members of the school community will not be tolerated, even if it is outside of school.
- Bullying goes against our values and the rules that clearly state we will be respectful to others.
- If you think you or others are being bullied, you must tell an adult and make sure they fully understand the seriousness of the situation. You can also email a member of staff.

Things You Cannot Bring To School




Mobile phones

- o If you have a mobile phone, don't bring it to school
- We strongly discourage pupils from having a phone with them for their journey to and from school as it makes you a target for crime
- If your parents/carers want to request that you are allowed to have your phone for the journey, you must use a phone that is not a smart phone and does not have a camera. When you arrive at school this must be switched off and placed in your locker.
- We do not accept responsibility for any mobile phones, and any phone found on a pupil or their bag during the school day will be confiscated, and returned to a parent/carer at a mutually agreed meeting

Money

- We have a cashless catering system, which means there is no need for you to bring money to school, except on days when we are fundraising for charities
- Chewing gum, sweets and snacks
 - Chewing gum is not allowed. You can bring water in a reusable container and fruit or vegetables to be eaten during break, but nothing else.









Uniform

You must wear the correct and complete uniform throughout the day, and on your way to and from school. Our uniform can be purchased from Uniform Direct. Please label all items of uniform with your name.

Blazer: Saracens High School blazer with Saracens High School badge. Worn at all times unless your teacher gives permission

Shirt: White shirt with collar. Top button fastened, and shirt completely tucked in at all times

Tie: Saracens High School tie in house colours, tied with the badge fully visible

Jumper: Saracens High School jumper is optional. It is the only jumper permitted

Skirt or Trousers: Saracens High School black skirt with the school logo, worn to the knee, or Saracens High School black trousers with the school logo. One black belt if required

Socks: Matching black socks with no pattern or plain black 70 denier tights

Shoes: Plain, black leather-style lace-up or slip-on formal shoes. Black laces only. No trainers, plimsolls or canvas shoes. No coloured laces. No logos or embellishment. No open-toe shoes or sandals, boots, high heels or wedges. For more information https://saracenshigh.org/school-uniform/

Head coverings: All religious head coverings must be black with no embellishment

Jewellery: Is not permitted but pupils with pierced ears may wear one small gold or silver stud per ear. A wrist watch is permitted. Any other jewellery will be confiscated and returned to parents/carers

Piercings: Only one stud per ear is permitted. No other piercings

School Bag: Saracens High School bag with the school logo

Outdoor coat: Black coat with no obvious logo. Coats should be stored in the locker or bag while in the building

Hairstyle: Hair should be neat and tidy at all times. Long hair should be tied back with a black hairband. No designs shaved in hair or eyebrows. No extreme hairstyles or unnatural colours (peroxide, bright hair dye, etc.)

Make up: Make-up, nail varnish and false nails are not permitted

Hats: Non-religious head coverings are not permitted

For PE and sports activities:

- Saracens High School sports top with the school logo
- Saracens High School shorts or skirt
- Saracens High School sweatshirt with the school logo
- Saracens High School tracksuit trousers (optional)
- Plain black football socks
- Plain black trainers with non-marking soles and minimal logo
