Course Summary:

A Level Spanish qualification splits learning into three sections:

- Develop research skills in Spanish relating to the country or countries where Spanish is spoken
- Understand how Spanish-speaking society has been shaped socially and culturally and how it continues to change.
- Develop knowledge and understanding of themes relating to the culture and society of countries where Spanish is spoken, and language skills.

Skills:

- Think creatively, analytically, and critically
- Language learning skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing
- Using communication strategies such as adjusting the message, circumlocution, self-correction and repair strategies.
- Apply knowledge of pronunciation, morphology and syntax, vocabulary and idiom to communicate accurately and coherently, using a range of expression
- Infer meaning from complex spoken and written material
- Summarise information from spoken and written sources

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Assessments:

- Paper 1 – Listening, Reading and Writing (50%)
- Paper 2 - Writing (20%)
- Paper 3 - Speaking (30%)

Themes:

- Social issues and trends
- Political and artistic culture
- Grammar
- Literary texts and film
